## CADRE FELLOWSHIP AT A GLANCE

- In-person Orientation: Getting to know each other and each other's work; looking at professional trajectories; networking with peers, near-peers, and PIs; and getting to know NSF and the DR K-12 program.
- Webinars: Four strands – career pathways, writing for publication, networking, and proposal writing. Interactive sessions led by a panel of DR K-12 awardees.
- Collaborative Projects: Small group assignments associated with the different strands (e.g., updating your CV, drafting a research statement, peer reviewing a prepared manuscript, or researching potential journals for a particular topic of interest).
- Mock Review: Orientation to the DR K-12 review process, and mock review led by NSF program officer.
- DR K-12 PI Meeting: Fellows attend PI meeting where they participate in sessions, meet informally with awardees, and learn about NSF.
- Informal Networking: Fellows encouraged to follow up with webinar panelists whose research areas align with their own. CADRE also arranges for interested Fellows to be paired with Fellows alumni, PIs, or leaders in specific fields to explore particular research interests or career possibilities (e.g., preparing for a job interview; identifying research gaps in a specific discipline; switching from academia or transitioning into academia).
