



CADRE FELLOWSHIP AT A GLANCE

- In-person Orientation: Getting to know each other and each others' work; looking at own professional trajectories; and initial introduction to what it's like to be a PI
- Webinars: Three strands – career trajectories, writing for publication, proposal writing with PI panels/fishbowls. Fellows may review recordings of previous cohort sessions.
- Collaborative Projects: Small group writing projects (e.g., peer editing a prepared manuscript, researching potential journals for a particular topic of interest, preparing a letter to the editor of an educational journal)
- Informal Mentoring: Fellows encouraged to follow-up with presenters whose research areas align with their own. CADRE also arranges for interested fellows to be paired with PIs or leaders in specific fields to explore particular research interests or career possibilities (e.g., preparing for a job interview at university; identifying research gaps in a specific discipline; switching from academia or transitioning into academia)
- Mock Review: Orientation to review process, and mock review led by NSF program director
- Learning about NSF: Small group, in-person meetings with program director
- Networking with Experienced Researchers and Developers: Fellows attend annual DR K-12 PI meeting where they attend sessions and meet informally with awardees
